

Combining Sentences: Compound Subjects

These are tongue twisters. Notice that the first one has a simple subject and a simple predicate. The second one has a compound subject.

Sassy Sally sipped some soda through a straw.

Sassy Sally and Silly Sam sipped some soda through a straw.
